Abstract:

Quadruplicity Drinks Procrastination is a participatory generative narrative environment that delves into the grey area triangulated by intuition, fluency and context, which underlies all human linguistic function and enables our daily social existence. Constructed atop a new, standards-based implementation of the Generative Platform Environment debuted at GA2009, this work relies on distributed interaction to relocate the heated and sometimes satirical academic discourse surrounding comprehensibility and meaning to a media-saturated online realm that often can be devoid of both.
